Park Manager's Report

Hi all;

This week brings much needed warmth after a long cold winter and with it a great deal of melting snow, as well as a promise of spring and soon summer.

Conservation Officers have been monitoring the lake and remind all fishermen that your ice shack must be removed from the lake before April 1st or be subject to a hefty fine. **And, Please clean up after yourselves, remember the lake is only ours to borrow.**

I am pleased to inform you that the majority of last years staff have committed to return for the 2019 park season, leaving just a few openings in the store, gatehouse and maintenance areas. We have already received several resumes and will conduct interviews shortly, so if you are wishing to apply for summer employment here in the park please get your application in quickly.

We were able to complete most of the work in the park last fall and are hoping for a timely start up this season.

Our shower house committee are preparing to get final plans, location, and possible funding opportunities to the board for approval so they can get the project out to tender. This project will be the boards major point of focus for the 2019 season as well as major upgrades to our park security systems. We have purchased several more motion lights and new state of the art camera systems which we will be installing in the Park Store, Gatehouse, Montgomery Hall and our Fuel and Garbage bin areas. These high-resolution cameras will monitor and record all park activities 24/7 in these key areas of the park and will provide increased security for all Kip Park properties. As always, enjoy and respect our beautiful park. Til next time.

Cabin Holders, Did You Know:

The RM of Pleasentdale are legislated by the Government of Saskatchewan to collect education tax on their behalf on the value of your cabin/home at the lake based on SAMA's assessed property value. This tax is a provincial education tax only and is due by December 31st each year. The RM are not compensated by the Provincial Government for collecting this tax and therefore pass their collection costs on to the Park.

Because the RM of Pleasentdale do not collect a property tax from you the cabin holder, they are not responsible to provide any services to you for your property, ie. Garbage collection, water supply, road maintenance, snow removal, property sales information, etc. These services are provided by the park only, as part of your annual lease fee. Each time you contact the RM of Pleasentdale with property concerns, maintenance concerns or general questions regarding your park property, the park is charged by the RM for this service. We ask you, your realtor and or your legal council to please direct all your questions in this regard to Mr. Ken Peterson, your Park Manager for clarification. We will do our best to help you with your inquiry and reduce unnecessary costs from being charged to the park and ultimately passed on to you by increasing your annual lease fees. A Message from Kip Park



Dear Cabin Holder's and Seasonal Campers;

It is imperative that we at the park always have current and accurate contact information for all Cabin Holders and Seasonal Campers. This information is required for us to be able to contact you in case of an emergency in the park, ie break in's, fire, park notices or a natural disaster that may affect you or your property. It is also required for the Provincial Government to send education tax assessments, notices and invoices that also affect your park property. Over the past several years some of you have dropped your land line and moved to cellular phones, or have moved changing your mailing address, or changed internet providers and thus changed your email address. Some of you are snowbirds and are away in the winter months and are using a different email or phone number at that time.

Please take the time to update this form with all your current information. Together we can improve park communication and keep you informed. It will be kept private and is required for park business only. You can e:mail this information if you wish to info@kippark.ca
