Park Maintenance Report

The staff in maintenance have been working hard to make Kipabiskau Regional Park the best that it can be. We work shifts, from 8:00am to 4:30 pm daily and the maintenance staff are here and available 7 days a week. We meet every morning just after 7:30 am and look at the list the duties that need to be accomplished. We divide and conquer the list, with each staff member toting his weight for the team. The weather has been on our side and we have been able to keep things looking wonderful. Wayne and Matt have been keeping the water plant running smooth, filters are changed regularly, chlorine levels are checked, and the water is tested daily. Monthly samples are also sent to Regina for Provincial Lab testing. We have been cleaning, and pressure washing our equipment during down times to keep everything in clean, working order and servicing as required. The main beach area is tilled daily and all washrooms in the park are cleaned and stocked three times a day as well. If you are looking for a reasonably priced fishing boat, we have an almost new 16-foot aluminum, an older 16-foot aluminum and a 14-foot aluminum boat for sale as well as 2, 5hp Honda and 1, 8hp Honda outboards. If you don't mind a challenge, we also have 4 paddle boats in various condition, that need a little TLC, for sale as well. Therefore, I would request that you enjoy your activities with prevention of shoreline damage in mind and create your waves in areas farther away from the cabins, main beach and campgrounds. Please try and stay on the south side of the lake and if possible, east or west of the cabins. Also, the buoys are intended to create a No Wake zone for children and families to enjoy the water in front of their cabins, main beach and lake front camping areas. Please observe this basic marine courtesy as the lake is for all to share.

In addition, I remind motorists that we have many youngsters who are enjoying the freedom of playing at Kipabiskau and may not be as traffic alert as they might be in their own community. Therefore, I ask each of you to drive within the posted speed limits and to be on the look out for children to avoid any possible mishaps. Please be safe and enjoy your time in the park.

It is also required for the Provincial Government to send education tax assessments, notices and invoices that also affect your park property.
