We will be posting any changes in the window as well. These decisions are a cost saving measure and have to be made according to store traffic and weather. Our planned last day of operation is Monday September 2nd, after which time we will take a few days to wash, clean, and refresh the paint in the store for next year.

We would like to thank, Sheila and Ron Heilser and their talented friend, for the donation and painting of the new mural for the west wall of the store. It is absolutely beautiful, and will be enjoyed by all for many years to come.

Tash and I have been very busy learning in our new role as co-supervisors in the park store and gatehouse. It has been a challenge to say the least, but a welcomed change. We have tried to serve you to the best of our abilities throughout the summer and have learned from this new challenge. Thank you all for your patience and patronage and we look forward to seeing you again next summer.

Park Maintenance Report

Maintenance is now in wind down mode. We will continue to manicure the grass in a timely fashion, but have cut back on mowing. With the lack of rain we are concerned the sun will burn and yellow the grass. We are pleased to report that all park patrons are respecting our park garbage and disposal policies. We haven't had one issue with the garbage bins since the new security cameras have been installed and our upper maintenance yard has been respected as well. Thank-you.

I would like to bring to your attention a situation that is becoming a serious concern. Golf carts! We have had far too many close calls, driving on the wrong side of the road, cutting vehicles off, and many under age driver's with a lack of experience darting in front of vehicles and our lawn mowers. Please understand that we wear ear protection and can not hear you approaching us. The law states that you must be sixteen and have a valid drivers licence to operate a golf cart. One accident, or one injury to a child is too many! Driving a golf cart in the park is a privilege. The park board banned the use of quads in the park from May 15th to September 15th many years ago. Please don't place them in a position of making a decision to ban golf carts as well.

The water treatment plant is scheduled to be shut down on September 9th. Our last full day of park water supply operation will be Sunday September 8th, so please plan accordingly. We have to shut down early this year in preparation of the planned construction of the new shower building and to repair some water supply lines.

We will be here for the better part of September cleaning up the balance of our park shut down duties and servicing our equipment for next spring. If you need any help, please don't hesitate to ask.

Wayne, Robert, William, Jon and myself, Matt would like to wish you all a safe and happy fall and winter and look forward to returning to duty next April.

The Park Board has decided to proceed with the construction of a new shower and bathroom building (“building”). After more than a year of planning, seeking competitive bids and finalizing the construction details, we have selected Tremblay Construction of Melfort to build our new facility. It will be constructed in the same area as the old facility. The activity of removing the old building and preparing the site will commence on September 8th. The plans call for the new structure to be completed by February 1st 2020 so we will have the new, fully assessible shower and bathroom facility for the opening of the 2020 park season.

The August long weekend was busy as usual, and many patrons enjoyed activities and the many things the park has to offer. I am very happy to report that Kevin Moulds, our Park Administrator, and our gate security commissionaire did not have any major problems over the weekend.

I would also like to thank those boaters who are doing their part to protect our shorelines by keeping the big waves away from our cabins and beaches. It not only helps preserve our shores but makes it safe for the people swimming inside the bouys. Remember the lake is ours to be shared with all that enjoy its natural beauty. So lets all do our part to continue to respect the rights of all those on the water.

As we prepare for the shut down in September, I would like on behalf of the Park Authority to thank Kevin, our new Park Administrator, for making our year of transition as smooth as possible. Thanks to Wayne our Maintenance Foreman, and his team, Robert, Matthew, William and Jonothan for their efforts in keeping the park clean, tidy and a beautiful place to live and visit. Also, thanks to Tash and Chantel our Co-Supervisors of the store and gatehouse and their team, for keeping the store, gatehouse and campsites operating smoothly.
