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Park Administrator's Report

At present our Park Board have chosen to only open the park to Cabin Holders and Seasonal Campers. We will not be taking reservations for daily camping until we can open our bathroom and shower facilities. The fish filleting shack is open to one person at a time and you **MUST** clean and rinse after each use. There is no fishing allowed off any park docks or marinas due to Covid19 requirements. The park store, hall and laundry, will remain closed until further notice, we will be selling premium fuel, however, by appointment only during common business hours please. Contact me to arrange an appropriate time meet, and we will only be accepting electronic payment for fuel purchases. Some of you have chosen this time of isolation to travel to your cabins and do some renovations. Please remember to follow park rules regarding what you can and cannot place in the park garbage bins. Signs clearly state that no non-household garbage is to be placed in the bins and that you **MUST** flatten all cardboard boxes. Please follow these rules as our garbage removal costs have risen dramatically this year.

The upper storage compound has been cleared, and we have a burning pile for leaves and tree branches **ONLY**. You can park your boat trailer in this area, orderly, by permission only, and you must identify your trailer. The Provincial Government has renewed our Park Land Lease and we have been granted a 33-year lease term, which will now expire in March of 2052. If you have not already done so, make sure we have all your up to date contact information so we can process the new paperwork correctly and in a timely manor, when approved.

Please take a moment and add me to your contact information, throw me a text or send me an email. I am available during normal hours. Check our website often for park announcements and please follow us on Facebook. Lets keep the lines of communication open. Take care of yourselves and stay safe.

We also have openings on the Cabinholders Association executive. Both of these volunteer groups could use additional support.

At this point in time it looks like we will not be holding pancake breakfasts but we will continue to have our bottle drives on the Sunday of the long weekends. Our next bottle drive will be Sunday July 5th. Please leave your bottles on the road for pickup that morning as we will not be going door to door due to the pandemic. Volunteers are required for bottle pickup and sorting. Please meet in the maintenance shed at 10:00am on that day. Proper distancing will be adhered to. Additional help would be greatly appreciated. Our 2019 bottle drives earned us \$5,567.45!

Other income sources in 2019 included \$2,132.00 from the pancake breakfasts and \$521.05 from the golf tournament. Thank you to the organizers and the participants for all of our events! Without volunteers and organizers, we would not be able to continue.

So far in 2020 we have purchased new tables and chairs for the store and will be purchasing flag poles to be installed at the Park entrance.

Our current balance is just over \$2,000 but will continue to increase with our bottle drives. As we indicated last month the Board has decided that the Park will follow all of the Provincial and Federal regulations and policies as they apply to the Park, while seeking advice from the Saskatchewan Regional Park Association on their implementation. There has been a great deal of disagreement over the protocols and whether or not they have been necessary or effective. Regardless of your position on the issue, we are asking everyone to abide by the rules. As the Re-Open Saskatchewan plan continues to unfold, we will be making changes. I would recommend that everyone go to saskregionalparks.ca website and get the details. I would also ask that everyone, cabin owners, seasonal campers and service personnel treat all of our employees, and especially our gatehouse employees with respect and kindness and to please address any of your concerns with the Park Administrator, Kevin Moulds.

At this time the store will remain closed. However, as Kevin has indicated we have opened the children's playground and the beach. We were not granted permission to open the washrooms/shower/change room at Montgomery Hall as we have operated in the past. We would have had to isolate the showers, even if we did not supply water to the showers. We will continue to have discussions with the Provincial officials and hopefully we will be able to get back to a normal washroom/shower/change room situation very quickly. However, we did open the washrooms by the lakefront seasonal camper area. Yes, we would love to have everything back where it used to be, but there are new rules!

I hope we are able to move quickly and safely to a new normal place. I wish everyone a successful transition in your own families and your neighborhoods. Be careful and be safe.
