Park Administrator's Report

The park is now open to Saskatchewan, daily campers with trailers that are self contained due to the Covid 19 restrictions.

The fish filleting shack is open to one family at a time and you **MUST** clean and rinse after each use. There is no fishing allowed off any park docks or marinas due to Covid 19 restrictions. The park store is now open Wednesday to Sunday, noon to 8pm daily. We offer lake basics, from ice cream to pop, chips and ice as well as premium fuel and bait for our fishing enthusiasts. We will be closed Monday and Tuesday until further notice. Our public Showers, Hall and Laundry facilities remain closed due to the Covid 19 requirements. If you require fuel on Monday and Tuesday I can accommodate by appointment during common business hours please. Contact me to arrange an appropriate time meet, and we will only be accepting electronic payment for fuel purchases.

If you wish to remove weeds from your lakefront, please contact me so I can place your name and cabin number on our annual permit for inspection. All weeds must be removed from the water and placed in the appropriate area in the upper compound.

You can park your boat trailer in this area, orderly, by permission only, and you must identify your trailer. The Provincial Government has renewed our Park Land Lease and we have been granted a 33-year lease term, which will now expire in March of 2052. If you require a copy of the new lease for business purposes, a copy is available under the "Bylaws" section on the website. Please take a moment and add me to your contact information, throw me a text or send me an email. I am available during normal hours. Check our website often for park announcements and please follow us on Facebook. Lets keep the lines of communication open. Finally I remind you that you are responsible for your guests and their behavior in your park. Enough said!
